1. First Reading: Amendment #7 to Contract 164-123122SS (C000460) - PowerDMS Licenses and Support for the Boone County Sheriff's Office

Senior Buyer Amy Gerskin read the following memo:

Purchasing requests approval for Amendment #7 to contract C000460, awarded from Sole Source Agreement 164-123122SS, for PowerDMS License and Support for the Boone County Sheriff's Office. The original contract was established October 11, 2022, through Commission Order 490-2022.

Amendment #7 adds an annual subscription for PowerReady and a one-time PowerReady Setup for the 2026-2027 period. The total for the first year is \$10,519.75.



4. Commissioner Reports

Commissioner Thompson stated she has been participating, through the Episcopal Diocese of Missouri, in a book conversation about a book written by a psychologist now based in St. Louis on the psychology of gun violence. Commissioner Thompson stated it is a fascinating read and some of the things going on in our community to address gun violence are things that are being tried out with a lot of success on the national level. Commissioner Thompson stated one of the things that really struck her was the interventions being used in both Baltimore and Philadelphia, especially with the youth in the community. Commissioner Thompson stated they have the peers, both in the streets with these kids and also meeting kids in hospitals if they have experienced gun violence and have survived. Commissioner Thompson stated, when she was in Philadelphia last year for the NACo Annual Conference, one of the speakers on a panel she facilitated was one such peer that went into the hospitals. Commissioner Thompson stated the peers are really needed to help intervene and help create new paths. Commissioner Thompson

stated this is a resource-intensive activity, but they have seen a lot of success in getting kids out of that reactive mode of always moving toward utilizing a gun. Commissioner Thompson stated the discussion has been fascinating and the readings from last night she found particularly engaging, especially because of the references to the programming she had heard discussions about last summer.
